

Utility Help in Massachusetts

EMERGENCY UTILITY HELP

- HAF (<u>Homeowner Assistance Fund</u> <u>one pager</u>) and RAFT (<u>Residential Assistance for Families in Transition</u>) benefits can be used for utility payment help for qualified low-income renters and homeowners, for current or overdue utility bills and other expenses
- Apply for <u>help with rent, mortgage or utility bills</u>, or contact <u>Regional Housing Administering Agencies</u> for assistance
- Immigrants may apply, even if the household is not eligible for LIHEAP or other benefit programs
- Benefits may be available for electricity, gas, water and sewer, trash removal, and other energy and utility costs
- Housing Consumer Education Centers are available to help

ACP (Affordable Connectivity Program) AND LIFELINE

- Funds to help pay for broadband internet services and devices (a laptop, computer or tablet) are available through the <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u>
- Households may also apply for Lifeline benefits for additional help with phone and internet costs

UTILITY PROGRAMS (CONTACT THE UTILITY COMPANY TO APPLY):

- Arrearage Management Programs (AMPs): Each utility company offers AMPs to eligible low-income
 customers with overdue utility bills and cancel these arrearages when customers enter and follow
 through with a payment plan
- Discount Rate: Low-income customers can receive a discount of up to 32% on utility bills
- Contact your utility company for details

PROTECTIONS FROM UTILITY DISCONNECTION

 Contact your utility company or municipal utility to apply for special protections during the winter season, or for customers with a serious illness, infants, and seniors

FUEL ASSISTANCE OR LIHEAP (LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM)

- Applications are usually accepted in September or earlier, contact your local community action agency or other LIHEAP agency

- The local community action agency/LIHEAP program may have information about other assistance available in the community, such as the <u>Good Neighbor Energy Fund</u>
